Michael S. Lyons MD, MPH is an Associate Professor of Emergency Medicine and practicing emergency physician at University of Cincinnati. He also leads the UC Early Intervention Program (EIP), seeking improve early diagnosis and linkage to care for various health conditions.

Dr. Lyons completed his undergraduate studies at Northwestern University and attended medical school at Duke University. He then served as a resident and chief resident at the University of Cincinnati, which was the first emergency medicine residency program ever created. Dr. Lyons has also completed a Master of Public Health degree at Emory University.

Dr. Lyons frequently partners with local and state health departments on issues that span the public health and healthcare sectors. His corresponding program of research focuses on early detection and intervention for threats to public health, and implementation of prevention interventions in acute care settings. He has been funded as a primary investigator by NIH and AHRQ, and has served as a co-investigator on several trials funded by the NIH and CDC which have focused on the problem of substance use disorders. He is also a co-investigator for the Ohio Valley Node of the NIDA Clinical Trials Network.
